

Safe Homes Pledge

A Program of the Eagle County Parent Network

The Safe Homes Pledge is a drug-prevention program for parents and guardians of youth in 6th- 12th grades. The SAFE HOMES program offers parents an opportunity to join together in providing safe environments for their teenagers to socialize while presenting a clear message to all youth that there will be NO USE of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs in their community.

By signing the SAFE HOMES pledge below you agree:

- (1) to actively supervise all gatherings/parties in your home.
- (2) not to serve alcohol to any guest under the age of 21 years of age.
- (3) that you will not allow the possession or use of tobacco, alcohol or drugs by youth in your home or on your property.
- (4) to acknowledge that there are civil/criminal offenses associated with serving alcohol to anyone under 21 years of age.
- (5) that you are willing to have your name and phone number published periodically in school handouts, newspapers or other media to inform other parents that you have signed the Safe Homes Pledge and agree to abide by its terms.

By signing the SAFE HOMES Pledge, you will join hundreds of other parents in your community who are actively trying to prevent underage drinking and teen drug abuse.
